LEADERSHIP UPDATE

With change comes exciting opportunities. The Board unanimously agreed that MedWish had the perfect candidate within our own organization - Britta Latz. Britta has been with MedWish for over 6 years and knows the organization inside and out.



We are thrilled to have Britta as our new Executive Director and to put MedWish in her capable hands. Congratulations, Britta!

MedWish's Local & Domestic Giving Program was established to reduce health disparities of those who are underserved and unable to gain access to the medical supplies and equipment they need to maintain their health and wellbeing due to economic hardship. Since the start of the pandemic, MedWish has also served those on the front lines and social service agencies by distributing PPE, respiratory, and other critically needed supplies to combat the spread of COVID-19.

Thanks to grant funding and the generosity of our community, we have been able to operate this program fee-free since March 2021, and we plan to continue to pursue funding to make this possible in the long term. We estimate that over 75,000 people have been served by this program this year alone. Thank you to all of our supporters who have made this possible!

LOCAL RECIPIENT HIGHLIGHT

In 2021, MedWish began partnering with the Cleveland YWCA in their efforts to support women and families in our community. In August, a group from the YWCA came to MedWish to pick up hygiene items to give to the families they serve. They also received items from our Alternative Recycling Program^{*} to be used for art therapy.

These supplies will support Independence Place, a permanent supportive housing location for young women and families; Norma Herr, Cleveland's emergency shelter for women; and Cogswell Hall, a permanent supportive housing location for older adults. Overall, MedWish provided the YWCA 1,000 lbs. of materials to support their work at these locations. MedWish is excited to be able to provide these recipients with the PPE they need to stay safe and healthy, in

addition to supplies used for art therapy and other programs!

*Through our Alternative Recycling Program, we distribute repurposed supplies that are no longer sterile and/or expired, and therefore cannot be distributed for medical use, to be used for alternative purposes such as art projects and teaching tools.

MAKING A DIFFERENCE AROUND THE WORLD

So far in 2021, MedWish has shipped supplies to Albania, Chad, Colombia, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Ecuador, Egypt, Ethiopia, Ghana, Haiti, Honduras, India, Kenya, Lebanon, Lesotho, Mali, Mexico, Nicaragua, Niger, Nigeria, Pakistan, Papua New Guinea, Sierra Leone, St. Vincent & The Grenadines, Tanzania, Uganda, Ukraine, Vietnam, and Zimbabwe.

This has included 15 containers, 54 hand carries and 18 pallets full of lifesaving supplies and equipment. We estimate that this work has impacted nearly 2 million people so far this year!

INDIA: COVID-19 RECOVERY



This past spring, MedWish worked with local healthcare systems and Indian agencies* to respond to immediate needs arising from the COVID-19 surge and distribute oxygen concentrators, PPE and other medical supplies to healthcare facilities in New Delhi. Funds raised were used to support MedWish's efforts to prepare shipments and purchase critically needed supplies from the recipients' wishlists.

With your support, our team deployed over 20 oxygen concentrators to Hamari Udaan in New Delhi, India where they were distributed to Community Health Centers in Behror, Panipat, and Gwalior and immediately put to use saving lives.

AIDING KENYA



MedWish shipped two containers with Coptic Mission Africa to Kenya at the end of October, and we are projected to ship two more by year's end. These containers were filled with items such as hospital beds, an ultrasound machine, an infant warmer, gurneys, IV poles, and much more. The first container in October weighed over 17,000 lbs. and the second weighed 19,813 lbs., making it one of the heaviest containers we have shipped!
